



Hawaiian Humane Society Neuter Now Consultation Checklist

Information about the Neuter Now Certificate:

The Neuter Now Certificate covers the cost of a pre-surgical examination that ensures your pet is fit for surgery, the anesthetic agents used during the surgical procedure, sterilization surgery, and removal of stitches if needed. Additional charges may be added for dogs over the age of three, dogs over 45 pounds in weight and any animal with abnormal anatomy (retained testicles, in heat, pyometra, etc). The Neuter Now Certificate **does not** cover medications (antibiotics or pain relief) or any services required for the treatment of any post-surgical complications arising later than 24 hours after the surgery.

The Neuter Now Program has authorized hospitals to charge various service fees at their discretion. We have two mandatory service fees, which include a surgical room charge and antibiotics. We also charge additional fees for dogs who weight over 45 pounds or for animals with abnormal anatomy.

Surgical Room Charge & Intravenous Catheter - \$100.00

The surgical room charge helps cover the cost of our surgical monitoring devices, heating units and instrument cleaning/sterilization devices. An Intravenous Catheter allows direct access into a vein to administer all anesthetic agents, pain medications, and for emergency situations.

Antibiotics – Pricing is variable depending on pet’s weight

Despite the fact that we do our best to clean and disinfect your pet's skin prior to the surgery; perform the surgery in a closed environment; use sterilized surgical instruments, surgical gowns, surgical drapes and surgical gloves during the procedure; there is always a chance that bacteria could be introduced into the incision area from the environment. As such, we require the use of antibiotics for your pet when they undergo this surgical procedure. There are two options to choose from:

- Convenia Injection:** This injection is a one time injection lasting up to 14 days. – OR –
- Polyflex Injection + Clavamox Tablets:** Polyflex is given in hospital, and Clavamox will be continue at home.

We will not negotiate on these procedures.

Pre-Anesthetic Bloodwork	Pre-anesthetic bloodwork screens your pet’s vital organs for any abnormalities prior to the administration of anesthetic agents. This information allows the veterinarian to have a better knowledge of your pet’s health internally, and can make the best anesthetic protocol for your pet. The cost of the pre-anesthetic blood test is \$73.25 plus tax.		
Post-Operational Pain Relief	Your pet will receive a prophylactic pain relief injection prior to surgery. We offer for your pet to receive both a 24-hour NSAID injection (cats&dogs) and a four-day supply of oral pain medication (dogs) to be administered at home while your pet is in recovery for additional pain relief. The cost of pain relief ranges depending on the size of your pet.		
Intravenous Fluids	Intravenous fluids are beneficial to your animal during the surgery as it helps keep them hydrated as they have not had anything to drink since the night before, it maintains their blood pressure during the surgery, and allows faster clearance of the anesthetic drugs from your pet's body. The cost of IV fluid administration is \$15 plus tax.		
Elizabethan Collar (Cone of Shame)	Your pet may have stitches placed and we would like to avoid your pet from licking the incision. The Elizabethan collar helps protect the incision from irritation from licking which can also undo the stitches and reopening the surgery incision.		
Homeagain Microchip	Does your pet have a microchip? You may think that your pet is protected from getting lost. But accidents happen, and some things are out of your control. If your pet does run away or is stolen and is turned into another veterinary hospital, the Hawaiian Humane Society or the OSPCA; the staff at these facilities will scan your pet with a microchip reader to obtain their unique microchip number. An "Homeagain" Microchip can be implanted at a cost of \$35 plus tax.		
Simbadol Injection (Felines Only)	We offer a 24 hour pain relief injection for felines to help with pain management post operation. Our other pain relief injection felines receive if you decide to decline Simbadol, offers only 4-6 hours of pain control.
